



Important Changes to Your PPO Pharmacy Program

Effective May 1, 2009, your benefit plan will only cover generics for certain medications that control stomach acid and relieve heartburn. These medications are called proton pump inhibitors, or PPIs, and include brand-name drugs like Aciphex, Nexium, Prevacid, Prilosec, Protonix and Zegerid.

This does not mean you cannot buy the brand-name medication. It just means your plan will not cover the brand-name drug, and you will be responsible for the full cost of the brand-name drug.

If you take a brand-name PPI, talk to your doctor about switching to a generic to help you get the treatment you need – and save money.

Choose to use Generics and Save

Using generic drugs is one of the easiest ways to save money on your health care costs.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) requires generics to meet the same strength, safety and purity standards as brand-name drugs. And generics can be just as effective as their brand-name counterparts – but usually cost less.

* These medications are covered by your plan:

- For ages 18 and under;
- For ages 19 and over with prior authorization. Your doctor can request prior authorization if there is a diagnosis of one of the following conditions:
 1. Grade III Erosive Esophagitis,
 2. Grade IV Erosive Esophagitis, or
 3. Zollinger-Ellison syndrome.
